While we have grown quickly, the vision for our young people remains the same; to enable everyone to reach their potential by providing an innovative and inspiring learning experience.

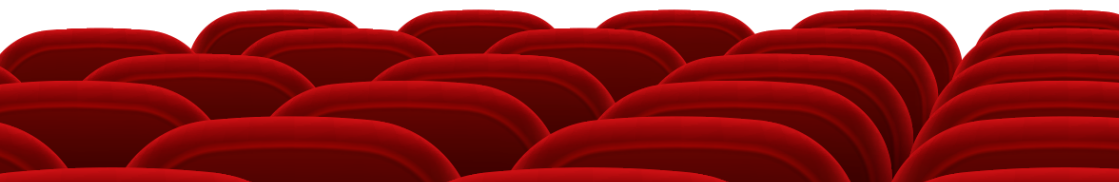

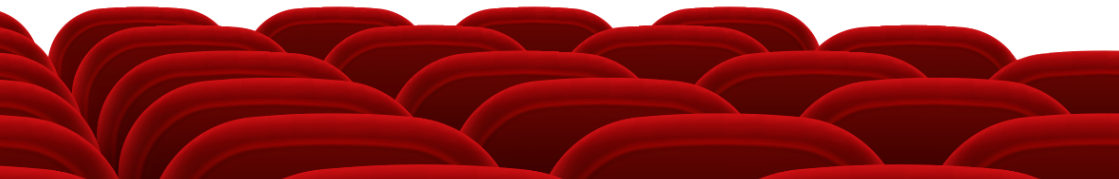
This is the first time that all 13 CET Schools have come together to perform collectively and tonight's event will see the culmination of several months of hard work, effort and rehearsals.

More than 8 million tonnes of plastic enter the ocean every year.

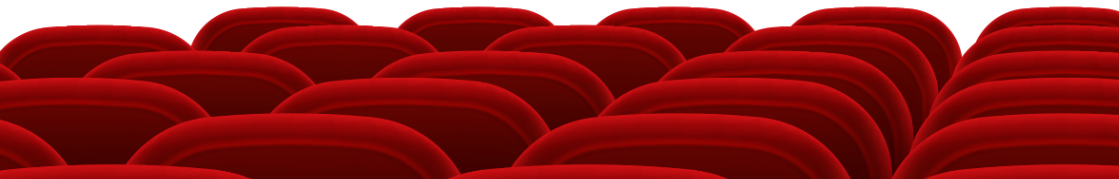

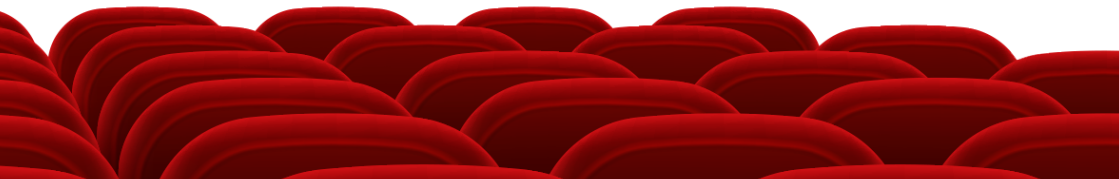

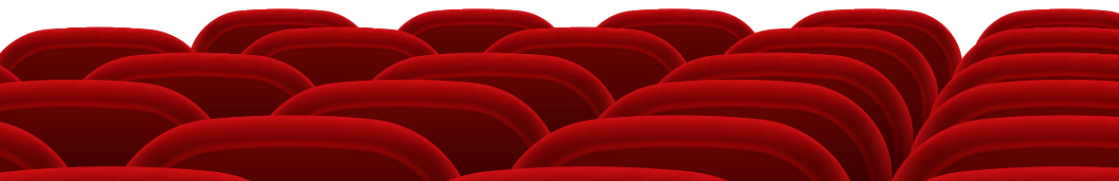

It'll be Ok



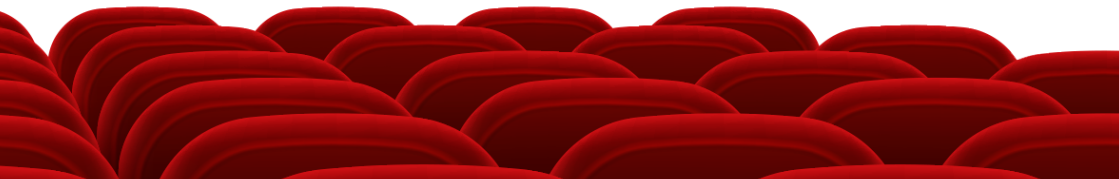
